
DEAN PITCHFORD (Stage Adaptation, Lyrics, Original Screenplay) was born and raised in Honolulu, Hawaii and graduated from Yale. He began his career as an actor off and on Broadway (GODSPELL, PIPPIN) before turning to songwriting ("Fame," "Let's Hear It For The Boy," "Footloose"), screenwriting (Footloose, Sing) and direct-ing (HBO's Bloodbrothers). He has been nominated for four Academy Awards (winning the Oscar and Golden Globe for Fame), five Grammys, and two Tonys. His songs have sold over seventy million records worldwide and have been recorded by artists as diverse as Whitney Houston, Barbra Streisand, L.L. Cool J, Cher, Richard Marx, Martina McBride and Hillary Duff. His stage musical adaptation of Footloose ran for over 700 performances on Broadway and is now being produced around the world. Dean lives in Los Angeles, where he continues to write songs, films, and books. His first novel, *The Big One-Oh*, was pub-lished to acclaim by Putnam in 2007; Putthe Young nam released Adult novel—Captain Nobody—in Spring, 2009.

WALTER BOBBIE (Stage Adaptation) directed Irving Berlin's White Christmas (San Francisco 2004, San Francisco, Los Angeles, and Boston 2005) and the Broadway revival of Sweet Charity starring Christina Applegate. He also directed Twentieth Century (2004) starring Alec Baldwin and Anne Heche, Footloose (1998), for which he also co-authored the book, and Rodgers and Hammerstein's A Grand Night For Singing (1993), which he also conceived. His direction of the international hit Chicago (1996) won him the Tony, Drama Desk, and Outer Critics Circle Award. Mr. Bobbie has also worked at the New York Shakespeare Festival, Manhattan Theatre Club, Ensemble Studio Theatre, Philadelphia Theatre Company, Sundance, the O'Neill Center and the Goodspeed Opera House. He is the former Artistic Director of City Center's Encores!, where he directed Fiorello, Chicago, Ten-



derloin, and Golden Boy. He also directed the Carnegie Hall concerts of Carousel (2002) starring Hugh Jackman and Audra McDonald, and South Pacific starring Brian Stokes Mitchell and Reba McEntire, which was filmed for PBS's Great Performances series in 2005.

TOM SNOW (Music) has been making music, recording albums and writing hits for himself and other artists-on record, on radio, in the United States and all over the world—since the early 1980s. He has twice been nominated for the Academy Award for Best Song from a Motion Picture: "Let's Hear It for the Boy" from *Footloose* (1984) and "After All" from *Chances Are* (1990); and he has twice been nominated for the Grammy Award: Best Album of Original Score written for a Motion Picture — Footloose soundtrack; and Song of the Year — "Don't Know Much." He has released four solo albums: Country (Clean Records, 1971), Taking It All in Stride (Capitol Records, 1975), Tom Snow (Capitol Records, 1976) and Hungry Nights (Arista Records, 1982). Tom's scoring work has appeared in films (Chances Are) and on television (Grand, Steel Magnolias, Teech, etc.) He has added songs to numerous motion pictures includ-



ing Honey, I Shrunk the Kids, Footloose, The Butcher's Wife, Sing, Oliver and Company, About Last Night, All the Right Moves, Two of a Kind, and Heart Like a Wheel. The biggest stars in the world have recorded Tom's songs, including Diana Ross, Ray Charles, Kenny Loggins, Cher, Thelma Houston, Michael Bolton, Art Garfunkel, Gladys Knight, Anne Murray, Ringo Starr, George Benson, Sergio Mendes, Deniece Williams, Tina Turner, Bette Midler and Dusty Springfield. His hit songs have been repeatedly honored with BMI Citations of Achievement for their radio popularity, songs like "Love Sneaking Up On You" (Bonnie Raitt), "Don't Know Much" (Linda Ronstadt and Aaron Neville), "If Ever You're In My Arms Again" (Peabo Bryson), "He's So Shy" (The Pointer Sisters), "Somewhere Down The Road" (Barry Manilow), "You Should Hear How She Talks About You" (Melissa Manchester) and "Deeper Than The Night" (Olivia Newton-John). In 1986 Tom won the prestigious Robert J. Burton Award for BMI's Most Performed Country Song of the Year — Dolly Parton's "Don't Call It Love." His latest projects embrace the worlds of pop music, motion pictures and the theatre (the stage adaptation of Footloose features nine new songs by Snow; he also contributed material for Amanda McBroom's Heartbeats). ABOUT THE THEATRE

THEATRE BY THE SEA, which is on the National Register of Historic Places, has had many incarnations over the years. The Tyler family purchased the property in the early '20s. After Alice Tyler was left a widow with three young children, she ran the property as a summer camp for girls. When the depression hit, she decided to create jobs and provide a future for her children by turning the barn into a theatre. The 300-seat theatre opened on August 7, 1933 with a production called Strictly Dynamite. That initial season lasted four weeks and featured four different plays, one of which was taken to New York. In 1938, a Yale Cooperative took over. Then, on September 2, a hurricane hit. The back wall of the theatre caved in and the stage roof was blown off. During the repairs, the theater was expanded to include a balcony. The newly enlarged theatre operated through 1941 and then went dark during the war. In 1946, the theatre's most glamorous and star-filled period began. The theatre became what is referred to as a "star-system" house opening with a show called Dream Girl which starred Judy Holliday. Other headliners who were brought in included Tallulah Bankhead, Mae West, Groucho Marx, and Marlon Brando. Following the 1958 season, the property was sold to the Bontecou family,

who leased it sporadically for several years, and by 1966 there were plans to tear down the theatre. Upon hearing that the theatre was to be destroyed, Tommy Brent, who had previously worked as a publicist for the theatre, returned and saved the theater from demolition. His first show opened on June 23, 1967 and he ran the theatre successfully for twenty-two years. In 1988, FourQuest Entertainment, which consisted of Laura Harris, (who had previously worked at the theatre for eleven summers), Renny Serre and Richard Ericson, came on board. Following extensive renovations. FourQuest reopened the theater in the spring of 1989 and continued producing high quality summer theater in Matunuck until the fall of 2003. The theatre went dark once again until 2007, when entrepreneur Bill Hanney purchased the property and, with producing partners, successfully mounted a production of A Funny Thing Happened on the Way to the Forum, just six weeks later, reopening the historic theatre on August 8, 2007. Theatre By The Sea continues to annually produce a successful four-musical subscription season along with a children's theatre and concert series.


