TIM RICE (Lyrics) Tim Rice was born in 1944. From 1956-1965 he wanted to be Elvis. Then he met Andrew Lloyd Webber, whose musical ambitions were in theatre rather than rock. They ioined forces as one could knock out a decent tune, the other had a way with words. They wrote four shows together. The first, The Likes of Us (1965-66), was never performed, but Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat (1968), Jesus Christ Superstar (1969-71) and Evita (1976-78) became, and indeed remain, hugely successful all around the world, on both stage and screen. Feeling certain that they could never top this lot, the pair went their separate ways in the early '80s, whereupon Andrew Llovd Webber

immediately topped that lot with Cats. TR then wrote Blondel (1983), a medieval romp, with Stephen Oliver, which ran for a year in London, but not for long anywhere else. In 1986 came Chess, written with ABBA's Bjorn Ulvaeus and Benny Andersson. Chess had a healthy UK run but flopped on Broadway in 1988. The New York Times bloke simply not getting it. In 1989 Rice translated the famous French Berger-Plamondon musical Starmania into English, which merely resulted in a hit album - in France. In the '90s he worked primarily with the Disney empire, contributing lyrics to the movies Aladdin (music Alan Menken) and The Lion King (music Elton John and Hans Zimmer) and to the stage shows Beauty and the Beast (Alan Menken). The Lion King and Aida (both Sir Elton). In lunch breaks he wrote the words for Cliff Richard's theatrical extravaganza Heathcliff (music John Farrar), which toured the UK in 1995-96. He is currently reworking an operatic musical he has written with Alan Menken (King David) and on new treatments, for both stage and screen, of Chess. The New York Times bloke having been replaced. He also has a new idea, which may or may not see the light of day. He has won many awards, mainly for the wrong things, or for simply turning up. He lives in England, has three children. his own cricket team and a knighthood (that's Sir Tim to you).

ANDREW LLOYD WEBBER (Music) Andrew Lloyd Webber is the composer of Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat, Jesus Christ Superstar, By Jeeves, Evita, Variations and Tell Me on a Sunday (later combined as Song & Dance),

Cats, Starlight Express, The Phantom of the Opera, Aspects of Love, Sunset Boulevard. Whistle Down the Wind. The Beautiful Game. The Woman in White. The Wizard of Oz. and School of Rock, He composed the film scores of Gumshoe and The Odessa File and a setting of the Latin Requiem Mass Requiem, for which he won a Grammy for Best Contemporary Composition. He has also produced in the West End and on Broadway not only his own work but the Olivier Award-winning plays La Bête and Daisv Pulls It Off. In summer 2002 in London he presented the groundbreaking A R Rahman musical Bombay Dreams, which has already been seen by more than one million people. He is currently working on a film version of The Phantom of the Opera directed by Joel Schumacher for release in December of this year. His awards include seven Tonys, three Grammys, six Oliviers, a Golden Globe, an Oscar, an International Emmy, the Praemium Imperiale and the Richard Rodgers Award for Excellence in Musical Theatre. He was knighted in 1992 by Her Majesty the Queen and created an honorary life peer in 1997.

**RICHARD SABELLICO** (Director and Choreographer). In New York City, Richard directed Wonderful Town (New York State Theatre). The Cocoanuts (American Place Theatre), A Majority of One (Drama Desk Nomination), The Home Of The Brave (Playhouse 91), I Can Get It For You Wholesale (Drama Desk Award), Rags, Milk and Honev (American Jewish Theatre). Leonard Bernstein: A Helluva Town (Rainbow and Stars) and was associate director to Arthur Laurents on the Broadway revival of Gypsy, starring Tyne Daly. National Tours in-

clude: State Fair w/ John Davidson. The Music Man (35th Anniversary Tour), and Dial M for Murder with Juliet Mills and Maxwell Caulfield. Richard has worked at most major theatres throughout the country with a host of extremely talented and interesting actors. In addition, he has written and/or doctored a sizable amount of produced properties as well as teaching a long running class; "Audition Therapy for the Musical Theatre." As an actor, Richard appeared in 7 Broadway shows; most notably as Rooster Hannigan in Annie, Pasty in Angela Lansbury's Gypsy, Manny in The Magic Show, Capt. / Hennessy in Dames At Sea (1985), as well as 3 flops. Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat is Richard's 15th production at Theatre By The Sea - Annie (1983), Woman of the Year (1985), Sugar Babies (1987), Kiss Me, Kate (1989), La Cage aux Folles (1989), The Boyfriend (1991), The Music Man (1991), Hello, Dolly! (1992), Funny Girl (1993), Little Rhody's Big Burlesque (1994), Comedy on Tap (1995), Annie (2013), Buddy (2016), and The Music Man (2017).

RYAN EDWARD WISE (Music Direction & Orchestrations) is thrilled to return to TBTS after music directing Nunsense back in 2013 and is happy to be back in the states after touring Europe conducting Grease das Musical. At Westchester Broadway: Camelot. West Side Story, Show Boat, Happy Days, Saturday Night Fever, and Mamma Mia! He is a former Associate Producer for Encore International, casting and producing shows for theme parks, cruise ships, and corporate events.

THEATRE BY THE SEA. which is on the National Register of Historic Places, has had many incarnations over the years. The Tyler family purchased the property in the early '20s. After Alice Tyler was left a widow with three young children. she ran the property as a summer camp for girls. When the depression hit, she decided to create jobs and provide a future for her children by turning the barn into a theatre. The 300-seat theatre opened on August 7, 1933 with a production called Strictly Dynamite. That initial season lasted four weeks and featured four different plays, one of which was taken to New York. In 1938. a Yale Cooperative took over. Then, on September

2, a hurricane hit. The back wall of the theatre caved in and the stage roof was blown off. During the repairs, the theater was expanded to include a balcony. The newly enlarged theatre operated through 1941 and then went dark during the war. In 1946, the theatre's most glamorous and star-filled period began. The theatre became what is referred to as a "star-system" house opening with a show called Dream Girl which starred Judy Holliday. Other headliners who were brought in included Tallulah Bankhead. Mae West, Groucho Marx, and Marlon Brando. Following the 1958 season. the property was sold to the Bontecou family, who leased it sporadically for several years, and by 1966 there were plans to tear down the theatre. Upon hearing that the theatre was to be destroyed. Tommy Brent, who had previously worked as a publicist for the theatre, returned and saved the theater from demolition. His first show opened on June 23, 1967 and he ran the theatre successfully for twenty-two vears. In 1988. FourOuest Entertainment, which consisted of Laura Harris, (who had previously worked at the theatre for eleven summers), Renny Serre and Richard Ericson, came on board. Following extensive renovations, FourQuest reopened the theater in the spring of 1989 and continued producing high quality summer theater in Matunuck until the fall of 2003. The theatre went dark once again until



2007, when entrepreneur Bill Hanney purchased the property and, with producing partners, successfully mounted a production of *A Funny Thing Happened on the Way to the Forum*, just six weeks later, reopening the historic theatre on August 8, 2007. Theatre By The Sea continues to annually produce a successful four-musical subscription season along with a children's theatre and concert series.
